- Primary School Brinje Grosuplje has 673 pupils, among which 48 pupils are children with special needs. 3 officially recognized educational programmes are intended for children with mild, moderate or severe mental disabilities.
- Pupils with disabilities and special needs share the school premises with other pupils without special needs.
- 12 pupils with special needs are attending the drama club. They are trying to include all 48 pupils into drama educational activities.
