The Culture Guides project

Culture Guides is a two-year project that started in October 2013 under the Grundtvig strand of the European Commission's Lifelong Learning Programme.

Six partners from five countries aimed to investigate the possibility of a European framework to recruit, train and manage volunteers to act as mentors or guides to introduce and help marginalised social groups to participate in local art and culture activities, either as audience members or as active participants.

Activities may include visits to professional art offerings, including theatre, art exhibitions, concerts, dance performances, museums, or participation in amateur art/voluntary cultural activities such as choirs, theatre, music groups, dancing groups or storytelling.

The project is grounded in the belief that a sustainable means of encouraging this type of beneficial engagement can be implemented with the help of volunteers and relevant support from interested organisations including local governments, cultural institutions, voluntary associations, health and social care organizations.
