





Pilot courses for managers and volunteers

2 October - 7 October 2017, Lousada, Portugal

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1. The frame

Course titles

The titles are respectively for

Course A: "Course for culture managers"
Course B: "Course for culture volunteers"

Time and place

The courses take place from Monday, 2 October, 9 am to Friday 6 October 12 pm in Lousada.

Part of an ERASMUS+ Multilateral Project

The two courses are part of the Erasmus+ Multilateral Project carried out in September 2016 – August 2018, entitled "Curricula for culture volunteers and managers in sparsely populated areas".

The courses are as part the Erasmus+ project planned as pilot courses, meaning their aim is to strengthen the competences of culture volunteers in sparsely populated areas to provide available and involving arts and culture opportunities for the local communities with an added value for civic participation, community bonding and local identity, targeting the wider European sector of voluntary arts and culture associations.

Course type

Both courses are planned as pilot types of residential 5-days in-service training courses.

The courses are arranged parallel to gain benefits from shared experiences between the group of managers and volunteers. The two groups of participants will thereby share some common lectures, plenum meetings, the one-day excursion, and joint social and cultural activities.

2. Target Audience

The Target Groups

The target groups for

- Course A are managers in amateur art and voluntary cultural associations working on a part-time or full-time basis, paid or voluntary, including directors, coordinators, consultants, counsellors, and other management staff.
- Course B are volunteers providing culture guide services on a part time basis, as volunteers referring to the involved associations of voluntary arts and culture.

Languages used

The working language is English, and the course materials will be provided in English.

Participants are expected to have good communicative skills in English.

Number of participants

The project partners from each participating country can enrol 4 trainees, plus 1 trainer to course A and 4 trainees, plus 1 trainer to course B. The total number of participants per course will be 25.

4. Key features

Aim and objectives

The overall aim is to strengthen the competences of culture volunteers in sparsely populated areas to provide available and involving arts and culture opportunities for the local communities with an added value for civic participation, community bonding and local identity, targeting the wider European sector of voluntary arts and culture associations.

The objectives are

- Recognise and validate their prior learning and articulate their competence profile and its relevance for working as culture volunteer.
- Understand and explain the possibilities of arts and culture to help to revive villages and remote areas.
- Plan culture projects that take into account the cultural and historical background and the historical continuity of the area
- Engage local stakeholders from the culture and educational institutions as well as the municipality and private business communities.
- Apply the needed team-leading skills to initiate, implement and complete cross-cultural activities with an added value for civic participation and community bonding.
- Promote and communicate the new culture activities to different audience groups and use a variety of dissemination channels in the local communities.
- Provide financial management of culture projects including efficient fund-raising to support the local activities.
- Assess and transfer the learning into own future tasks as culture volunteers.

Methodology

The course will be based on participatory and activity-based methods, and the intercultural learning about each other at the professional and the personal level will be a cross-curricular topic.

The course will focus on knowledge exchange and shared experiences. There will be a blend of lectures, trainers' presentations, plenum discussions, workshops, small group work, and individual learning. Short presentations on the topic prepared by participants themselves will be part of the course.

Sites visits to cultural activities in Lousada and other parts of Portugal will help the participants to experience "best practice" within the areas of focus.

Preparation

The participants will be invited to prepare a short presentation of best examples from their local culture guide activities.

Follow-up

The participants will complete an evaluation questionnaire at the end of the course about the hopes realized, the setting for the course, the programme of the course, the contents transferred etc.

After the course the participants will receive a summary of the training course content, activities and results including a summary of the course evaluation.

Certificate of Attendance

Participants will get a Certificate of Attendance stating the frame, content, method and the working hours of the course.

Travel to Lousada

The best way to travel from Porto Airport to Lousada is to take a taxi because the connections by public transports are quite challenging. The price of the taxi is around 50,00€. It's will be better to establish the price with the taxi driver before you take the taxi. You can find several taxis in front of the exit doors of the airport.

However, if you prefer to take a bus, you can find below the explanation on how to do it:

Porto airport - Take the Subway (violet line). Sept out the subway in "Trindade Station". Take the bus "Auto Viação Pacence" in "Trindade Street". Step out the bus in Lousada.
